The aims of our charity are:

- To rehabilitate raptors as quickly and efficiently as possible.
- To ensure that all raptor casualties are handled by competent persons.
- To correctly diagnose and treat the ailment, seeking veterinary advice when necessary.
- To provide adequate, suitable housing during their rehabilitation.
- To protect the interests of wild birds of prey from shooting, trapping, poisoning, removal from the nest, etc.
- To comment as a body on any impending Government legislation within The UK.
- To collect and hold relevant information for future reference.

National Help & Advice Line

The telephone help line provides assistance to anyone who encounters an injured bird of prey. Once relevant details have been provided, callers can be given instructions on how to care for the casualty, and in most cases will be given contact details of a local rehabilitator or experienced individuals who can collect the bird and transport it safely to specialist care facilities. When this is not possible, the charity is often able to provide contact details for veterinary surgeons or other local help.

The Raptor Rescue Rehabilitation Handbook and Code of Practice.

This complete handbook includes vital information for rehabilitators with chapters on facilities, husbandry, casualties and legislation. It has been produced in consultation with Defra, Animal Health, Scottish Government, Welsh Assembly Government, Northern Ireland DOE, RSPCA, Scottish SPCA, National Crime Unit and Police Wild Life Crime Officers. The Information can be accessed via the Charity’s website.

Accredited rehabilitators

We believe that all raptor rehabilitators should have both the facilities and knowledge to handle and care for any injured bird of prey. In order to ensure this is achieved we have produced a list of criteria against which each rehabilitation establishment can be assessed. Those which achieve the minimum standard can be classed as an accredited rehabilitator and will be used first and foremost for rehabilitating casualties.
